In Year 5, they learnt all about Passover and what Jewish people eat, how the table and plate is set and what all the foods represent. They also got the chance to try some of the foods, including bitter herbs and Matzo. The children absolutely loved the interactive sessions and getting their questions answered.

Mrs Elijah thoroughly enjoyed her time with us and was incredibly impressed with our respectful, kind and thoughtful children.



# Writing at STM

At STM, we are always looking at ways to improve the quality of the teaching and learning and the educational offer that our children receive. This year, one of the areas of focus is on Writing. The technical side of writing has always been a strength at school; however, we have recognised that we want to develop our children's 'writing for pleasure' and the enjoyment of the children using their imaginations and creativity.

As a result, all of our children are now receiving Creative Writing lessons, where they get to play games to develop their imaginations and creativity and then write their own original stories about whatever they wish and however they wish: with a friend or alone, using technology or pen and paper.

In addition to this, we are also teaching 'Oracy to Writing' lessons each term, which focus on our children becoming storytellers. This is achieved though using a range of drama activities and developing their presentational speaking and listening skills by listening to an expect storyteller and building on his ideas.

# Partnership with our Parish

We were delighted to once again lead the Family Mass at St. Edward's Church on the first Sunday of Advent. We were blown away by the incredible numbers in attendance and received beautiful feedback from many Parishioners. It was the first time that Fr. Elvis had heard our children sing and he was amazed! 
