Geography/History

Geography: We will be exploring human and physical features of Europe, including ocean currents and rivers.

History: Our main topic this term is Ancient Greece. We will be immersed in this topic from launch day, exploring life in Ancient Greece, looking at key figures, learning about the Olympic games, Athens and Sparta, and many other aspects of Ancient Greece.

Science

In Science, we will be looking at Living Things and their Habitat, and then Earth and Space.

We will look at the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird, amongst other things! In Earth and Space, we will explore the planets in our solar system in relation to the sun, and investigate the concept of day and night, amongst many other things too!

In art, we will be looking at sculpting, focussing on metal sculpting, inspired by Greek theatre masks. We will also move on to look at clay sculpting towards the end of the unit.

In DT, we will focus on how to use kitchen utensils, follow a recipe and understand how to adapt the ingredients to change the nutritional value.
